

2. Co-develop project process architectures, provide stewardship support to active and new projects according to CLI methodology and practices:

- Undertake background research on clients, potential partners, and topics of strategic interest
- Meet and/or interview partners and stakeholders to understand their strengths, needs, and aspirations in respect to relevant change processes
- Draft concept notes, offers, and proposals for CLI initiatives and work requested by clients
- Facilitate and participate in follow-up reviews
- Prepare reports for clients and for internal accountability

3. Conceptualize and fundraise for partnership projects that apply and convey CLI's methodology:

- Undertake background research on potential projects and funding opportunities (e.g. EU, German ministries, private foundations, etc.)
- Build a network of strategic partners for project acquisition and implementation
- Draft concept notes and project proposals
- Facilitate and participate in follow-up reviews
- Prepare reports for funders and for internal accountability
