CLI expects Collaboration Academies to act as catalysers for growing collaboration culture wherever they are established. Through a rigorous training programme, future Collective Leadership facilitators will gain the knowledge, skills, and practical experience necessary to independently and expertly guide multi-stakeholder sustainability initiatives in their city, country, or region.

CLI expects that Collaboration Academies will merge the multi-stakeholder collaboration expertise CLI has embedded in its methodology and curricula with the thematic and regional expertise of partners for fostering transformation processes that result in concrete local outcomes and further the global sustainability movement.
